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Canine Participation Agreement / Informed Consent

Your dog, _____, has agreed to participate as a blood donor in the **Sun States: Blood Banks for Animals** Blood Donor program.

Procedure: Your dog will be placed on a table and will be positioned by an experienced technician. A small area on his or her neck (or their front leg) will be shaved. The area will be cleaned with a sterile prep solution. A sterile, single-use blood collection kit will be used for blood collection. A needle will be placed into the neck or front leg vein. Depending upon the weight of your dog, up to 500mL will be drawn (for dogs 50 lbs. and above), or up to 250 mL will be drawn (for dogs 35-50 lbs.). The needle will be removed from the vein and pressure will be applied to the site for several minutes. A bandage will be placed over the site. The procedure is generally completed in 5-7 minutes.

Benefits: The direct benefits to your pet include a comprehensive annual screening including both general blood work and blood-borne disease screening and a blood donor ID tag. This blood work will be made available to you or your veterinarian upon your request. All testing is performed at no cost to you. Your dog will also receive a credit for one free unit of blood component per donation for life. It is possible that Sun States may find abnormalities in your dog's blood work. If this occurs, Sun States will notify you immediately and provide all information to your veterinarian so that your pet can receive prompt veterinary care. Indirect benefits to you and your pet include the satisfaction of helping save the lives of animals in need of blood products.

Risks: The most common risks associated with blood donation are bruising at the venipuncture site or the formation of a hematoma ("egg") at the site. These problems are self-limiting and pose no serious harm to your pet. It is also possible that your animal may experience rebleeding at the blood draw site. The likelihood of this can be reduced by not using a leash on your dog's collar for the rest of the day of the donation. If such bleeding occurs, it will generally stop in a short time with the application of direct pressure, and is not life-threatening if your dog does not have any existing clotting disorder. It is also possible that your animal may develop a "hot spot" or infection at the skin site, though this is not very common, and is readily treatable with no lasting harm to your pet. In rare circumstances, animals may experience a bit of "woozieness," usually as the result of an overdraw. Your animal will be given fluids to drink or via IV if this happens, and promptly treated this poses a low risk of harm to your pet. In human blood donor programs there have very rarely been serious events associated with blood donation including serious infections, heart attack, and death. While these are remote risks, at this time Sun States is not aware of any reports of such problems in the veterinary literature.

Your responsibilities: Most likely your dog will tolerate the procedure well without complications. It is important that if you notice signs of a hematoma that appears to be rapidly enlarging or infection at the venipuncture site that you seek prompt veterinary care. If any complications occur, please contact Sun States as well so that we can be made aware of the situation and avoid such problems in the future.

Statement of voluntariness: Sun States is extremely grateful for you and your pet's participation in our donor program. However, you are free to withdraw at any time, and there is no penalty to you for doing so. All credits earned from prior donations are retained, and blood work information on your pet will always be available to you and your veterinarian at no cost to you.
